1. General Provisions

1.1 These Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) regulate the procedure for organizing and conducting the International Competition of Applied Projects of Young Scientists and Students “Regulatory Policy and GR Communications” (hereinafter referred to as the Competition).

1.2. The competition is held within the framework of the Congress of Economists and Financiers of the Eurasian Economic Youth Forum (hereinafter referred to as EEYF) and is implemented at the main site of EEYF - at the Ural State University of Economics (hereinafter referred to as the USUE site); as well as on the site of the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow".

1.3. Internet address of the EEYF website www.eurasia-forum.ru

1.4. Organizer of the competition:

Federal State Budgetary Educational Institution of Higher Education "Ural State University of Economics" (Ural State University of Economics), Department of Economic Theory and Applied Sociology.

1.4 Partners and co-organizers of the Competition:

- Ministry of Economic Development of Russia,
- ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow" .

1.5 Purpose and objectives of the Competition:

1.5.1 The purpose of the competition “Regulatory Policy and GR Communications” is for young scientists and students to discuss the mechanism for solving economic problems from the perspective of various schools and areas of economic theory, in particular, from the perspective of behavioral economics, and to analyze the interaction of modern economic and psychological sciences.

1.5.2 Objectives of the Competition:

- attracting the attention of young people to such current areas of modern economic science as economic analysis of law, institutional and narrative economics;
- development of civil society in the regions and popularization of effective GR communications tools;
- generalization of practice and development of applied recommendations on the use of evidence-based policy methods, regulatory impact assessment and assessment of the application of mandatory requirements.

2. Thematic areas and nominations of the Competition

2.1. Thematic areas of the Competition:

1. Modern instruments of regulatory policy (“regulatory sandboxes”, assessment of regulatory impact, assessment of the application of mandatory requirements, examination of regulatory legal acts, risk-based approach in control and supervisory activities, lean regulation, client-oriented public administration).

2. Evidence-based policy (methodological development of an evidence-based approach to making management decisions; recommendations to authorities on solving socio-economic problems based on the use of economic and mathematical methods and modeling).

3. Assessing mandatory requirements: practices and recommendations for regions (solving cases for assessing regional, municipal mandatory requirements; developing a methodology for assessing standard regional, municipal mandatory requirements or implementing individual aspects of

the assessment; recommendations for improving approaches to assessing regulatory impact and assessing the application of mandatory requirements at the regional level).

4. GR technologies in Russia (public consultations within the framework of regulatory impact assessment, assessment of the application of mandatory requirements and examination of regulatory legal acts; public control; public and other advisory councils under government agencies).

5. Institutional and narrative economics (analysis of domestic public administration, the organization of dialogue between business and government, the system of regulation and support for entrepreneurship from the perspective of institutional and narrative economics).

2.2. In addition to the thematic areas of the Competition, in which competitive projects are presented and the winner and prize-winners of the Competition are determined, the competition of participants will include the fight for victory in special nominations of the Competition.

1. Special nomination: “Best practical recommendations on the application of methods for assessing mandatory requirements for regional authorities.”

The winner of the nomination receives a diploma from the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow" and the opportunity to undergo a two-week internship at the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow" (travel to the place and accommodation during the internship at the expense of the nominee), where he can, among other things, take part in the implementation of his initiatives.

2. Special nomination: “Best project for the development of modern regulatory policy instruments” or “Best project of a client-oriented approach in regulatory policy.”

The winner of the nomination receives a certificate from the Ministry of Economic Development of Russia and the opportunity to undergo a two-week internship at the Ministry of Economic Development of Russia (travel to the place and accommodation during the internship at the expense of the nominee), where he can, among other things, take part in the implementation of his initiative.

3. Conditions of participation in the Competition

3.1. Students, graduate students, young scientists, educational organizations, academic institutions and other interested organizations in Russia and foreign countries under the age of 35 are invited to participate in the Competition (hereinafter referred to as the Participants).

3.2. Projects for the Competition can be submitted **individually or from a team of authors of up to 3 people** .

3.3. All participants of the Competition are divided into two categories:


– participants are representatives of universities and organizations of the city of Moscow. These participants, the qualifying round and participation in the finals of the Competition will take place at the site of the ANO "Agency for Strategic Initiatives of the City of Moscow"

– participants are representatives of universities and organizations in other cities of Russia and foreign countries. This category of participants will undergo a qualifying round and participate in the finals of the Competition at the main site of the EEYF at USUE.

The final will be held simultaneously at both venues using video conferencing.

3.4. One participant has the right to submit only one project to the Competition.

3.5. The authors independently decide on which thematic area the work will be presented.

3.6. Projects of participants that do not meet the requirements of clause 5 of these Regulations will not be accepted for participation in the competition.

3.7. There is no registration fee for participation in the Competition. Expenses for accommodation of non-resident participants, food and transportation costs for participation in the full-time stage of the competition are paid by the participants themselves or by sending organizations.

4. Stages and timing of the Competition

4.1. The competition is an annual event and is held during the summer semester. The final dates for the Competition, as well as its main stages, are established by order of the rector of the Ural State University of Economics.

4.2. The competition is held in three stages.

4.2.1. **The first stage (until March 20, 2024 inclusive)** – acceptance and registration of competitive applied projects; checking projects for compliance with work requirements.

The first stage is carried out by the organizing committees of the Competition of the relevant sites:

- Organizing Committee of the USUE Main Site Competition;
- the organizing committee of the co-organizer of the Competition – ANO “Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow”.

4.2.2. **The second stage (qualifying) (from March 21 to April 1, 2024)** – examination of competitive projects registered and admitted to the Competition based on the results of the first stage; determination of the finalists of the Competition.

– **Conducting the qualifying stage at the USUE site**

The examination of competitive works is carried out by the expert commission of the USUE Competition site. The expert commission selects in absentia from the number of participants specified in clause 3.3. Regulations, **10 best works** to participate in the finals of the Competition.


– **Conducting the qualifying stage at the site of the ANO “Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow”**

The examination of competitive works is carried out by an expert commission of the Autonomous Non-Profit Organization “Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow”. The expert commission selects in absentia from the number of participants specified in clause 3.3. Regulations, **5 best works** to participate in the finals of the Competition.

The general list of Competition finalists from both sites is published on the Competition page of the EEYF website from **April 1 to April 10, 2024**.

4.2.3. **The third stage (final) (April 24-25, 2024)** – the finalists defend competitive applied projects simultaneously on two sites using video conferencing (VCC); determination of winners and prize-winners of the Competition.

The final experts of the competition are representatives of the expert commissions of both sites.

4.3. Based on the results of the Competition, a collection of abstracts of the finalists' works is published. The collection is published in the form of the corresponding chapter of the annual collection of EEYF materials no later than 4 months after the Competition. The collection of EEPM materials is posted in the RSCI, on the USUE website and on the EEPM website.

5. Registration of participants, requirements for submitted documentation and rules for registration of competitive works

5.1. Works are submitted to the Organizing Committees of the Competition in electronic form through a special registration form on the EEYF website [www . eurasia - forum . ru](http://www.eurasia-forum.ru) :

5.2. To participate in the Competition the following package of documents must be submitted:

1) the author’s statement about participation in the Competition (Appendix 1) - submitted by filling out the participant’s registration form on the EEYF website

If the work is prepared by a team of authors, one of the authors is registered as the team captain and attaches the work, the remaining participants are registered as team members. A team member can attach empty files to complete registration.

2) competition work (project) (with a title page in the form of Appendix 2) – attached as a separate file to the participant’s registration form;

3) abstracts of the work reflecting the main provisions and results of the project (in the form of Appendix 3) are attached as a second file to the participant’s registration form.

5.3. The competition entry must meet the following requirements:

1) must be submitted within the deadlines established by the rector of USUE and published on the EEYF website;

2) must correspond to the problems of the Competition and its thematic areas corresponding to clause 2 of these Regulations;

3) The work requires the presence of a reference apparatus: links to sources from which quotes are used, digital data in the text, tables, graphs, diagrams, bibliography (at least 5 sources);

4) the work must be original, the percentage of originality of the text must be at least 70%;

The competition entry (project) must be formatted in accordance with the following requirements: file in *.doc or *.rtf format, entitled with the author's last name, A4 format, Times New Roman font, font size – 14 pt, line spacing – one and a half. All margins are 20 mm. The text should be aligned in width without hyphenation. Sheet orientation is portrait. Paragraph indent – 1.25.

All charts and tables must be inserted into the text. The list of references (bibliography) is drawn up in accordance with GOST R 7.0.100-2018. Footnotes to the text are given in square brackets indicating the source number in the list of references.

6. Criteria for evaluating competitive works (projects)

6.1. At the first stage of the Competition, the organizing committee admits competitive works (scientific articles) for further expert evaluation according to the requirements specified in Section 5 of the Regulations.

6.2. Criteria for evaluating competitive works at the second (qualifying) stage:

- 1) paperwork – up to 10 points;
- 2) relevance of the research topic – up to 15 points;
- 3) novelty and originality of the research – up to 15 points;
- 4) content of the study: scientific, technical and economic feasibility of the proposed solutions; logic, scientific style and literacy of presentation; presence of applications, illustrations, graphic explanations of appropriate quality – up to 40 points;
- 5) practical significance of the research results, the possibility of testing and implementing the results obtained – 20 points.

Lists of finalists are posted on the Competition page. Information letters about reaching the finals are sent to the finalist participants.

If the finalist cannot personally take part in the final of the Competition, he is given the opportunity to publicly defend the competition work remotely, in the form of a webinar. If the finalist cannot take part in the final of the Competition remotely, the participant who took 16th place at the end of the second (qualifying) stage of the Competition is included in the finalists.

6.3. During the third (final) stage, members of the expert commission fill out an expert sheet for each finalist of the Competition.

Criteria for evaluating participants during the full-time defense of the competitive work at the third (final) stage:

- 1) relevance of the research topic – up to 15 points;
- 2) novelty and originality of the research – up to 15 points;
- 3) significance of the research results – up to 20 points;
- 4) presentation – up to 20 points;
- 5) defense (answers to expert questions) – up to 30 points.

6.5. If the winners and prize-winners of the Competition have the same (equal) number of points, the decision to determine the winners and prize-winners is made by the Expert Commission of the Competition.


7. Awarding the winners

7.1. Based on the results of the final of the Competition, the winners and prize-winners of the Competition are determined. Winners and runners-up are awarded Diplomas of 1st, 2nd, 3rd degree and large orders “Star of Eurasia” for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place, respectively.

Participants who took 4th and 5th places in the Competition are awarded Certificates for 4th and 5th places, respectively.

All participants of the Competition receive certificates of Competition finalists in electronic form.

7.2. Winners and runners-up (1st, 2nd and 3rd place) of the Competition are awarded cash prizes within the framework of the Competition prize fund, established on the basis of the order of the USUE Rector and in accordance with the protocols of the Expert Commissions of the Competition.

Cash prizes (including payment of income tax) are transferred by the Competition organizer within 1.5 months to the personal accounts of winners and prize-winners using the details provided to the Competition coordinator, subject to the submission of the following documents:

- printout from the bank’s personal account: bank details and personal account number for transferring money;

- a copy of the passport page 1, 2 and page with registration;

- a copy of the TIN or a printout of the TIN data from the website.

Cash prizes for foreign participants participating in the finals in person are issued at the USUE cash desk on the day of the award.

7.3. The winner of the special nomination: “Best practical recommendations for the application of methods for assessing mandatory requirements for regional authorities” receives a diploma from the ANO “Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow” and the opportunity to undergo a two-week internship at the ANO “Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow” (travel to the site and accommodation in internship period at the expense of the nominee), where he can, among other things, take part in the implementation of his initiative.

7.4. The winner of the special nomination: “Best project for the development of modern instruments of regulatory policy” or “Best project of a client-oriented approach in regulatory policy” receives a diploma from the Ministry of Economic Development of Russia and the opportunity to undergo a two-week internship at the Ministry of Economic Development of Russia (travel to the place and accommodation during the internship at the expense of the nominee), where he can, among other things, take part in the implementation of his initiative.

7.5. The awarding of all finalists of the Competition will take place as part of the final events of the XIV EEYF **on April 25, 2024** simultaneously at the USUE site and at the site of the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow" via online communication.

8. Management of the Competition on the USUE site

8.1. The Competition is managed by the EEYF Organizing Committee and the Competition Organizing Committee.

8.2. Chairman of the EEYF Organizing Committee - Rector of USUE:

- approves the Regulations on the Competition, signs the order on holding the Competition and the composition of the organizing committee of the Competition, the order on the composition of the expert commission of the Competition;

- carries out general management of the organization and conduct of EEYF events within the framework of which the Competition is held.

8.3. To organize and conduct the Competition, an organizing committee of the Competition is formed, consisting of:

- scientific director of the Competition;

- Competition coordinator;

- members of the expert committee of the Competition;

- representatives of organizations - partners of the Competition,

- Secretary(s) of the Competition.


8.4. Scientific director of the Competition:

- prepares the draft Regulations on the Competition, prepares amendments and additions to it;

- is the chairman (co-chairman) of the expert commission of the Competition;

- selects the composition of the expert commission of the Competition.

8.5. Competition Coordinator:

- ensures the invitation of members of the Expert Commission of the Competition;
- organizes the distribution of information letters to educational, research and scientific organizations of the Russian Federation and Eurasian countries;
- organizes registration (through the registration system of the EEYF website) and verification of compliance of received competition documents with established requirements, sends competition works to members of expert commissions for evaluation;
- organizes and monitors the progress of the Competition;
- organizes the work of the expert commission during the international finals of the Competition;
- organizes the registration of diplomas, certificates and awarding of the winners and prize-winners of the Competition;
- organizes the collection of abstracts of competitive works of the Competition finalists and their transfer to the USUE Publishing House for inclusion in the collection of EEYF materials;
- organizes the collection of necessary documents for issuing cash prizes to the winners and prize-winners of the Competition;
- draws up a report on the Competition.

8.6. To conduct an expert assessment of the finalists' competition works, a consolidated expert commission of the Competition is created.

The Chairman of the Expert Commission of the Competition is the General Director of the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow" Igor Viktorovich Smolnikov. The co-chairman of the Expert Commission of the Competition is the scientific director of the Competition, Doctor of Economics, Acting. Head of the Department of Economic Theory and Applied Sociology, Head of the Center for Regulatory Competencies of USUE Rakhmeeva Irina Igorevna.

The expert commission includes highly qualified teaching and research workers from USUE, leading specialists from the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow", as well as invited experts. Decisions of the expert commission are made by open voting, by a simple majority of votes of the members of the expert commission present, minutes are recorded, the minutes are signed by the chairman, secretary and members of the expert commission (Appendices 4, 6).

Information about the composition of the organizing committee and expert commission of the Competition is published annually on the Competition page of the EEYF website.

9. Management of the Competition on the site ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow"


1.1. The Competition is managed by the organizing committee of the EEYF site of the ANO "Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow",

1.2. The organizing committee of the EEYF Competition includes:

- Competition coordinator;
- an expert commission of the Competition consisting of at least 3 people from among highly qualified teaching and research workers of the university organizing the site, as well as invited experts.
- Secretary of the Competition.

1.3. Competition Coordinator:

- ensures the invitation of members of the expert commissions of the Competition;
- organizes the distribution of information letters to educational, research and scientific organizations of the city of Moscow;

- organizes registration (through the registration system of the EEYF website) and verification of compliance of received competition documents with established requirements, sends competition works to members of expert commissions for evaluation;
- organizes the work of the expert commission during the qualifying round of the Competition;
- together with the organizing committee of the USUE site, organizes the general final of the Competition on April 24, 2024; as well as the participation of contestants in the award procedure on April 25, 2024 at their Competition site;
- organizes the transfer to the Competition coordinator of the USUE site of abstracts of the site finalists for inclusion in the collection of EEYF materials.

9.4. To conduct an expert selection assessment of competitive works, an expert commission of the Competition site is created.

The composition of the Competition expert commission is approved by the organizing committee of the Competition site. The expert commission includes leading specialists from the Agency for Strategic Development of the City of Moscow, as well as invited experts. Decisions by the expert commission are made by open voting, by a simple majority of votes of the members of the expert commission present, minutes are recorded, the minutes are signed by the chairman, secretary and members of the expert commission (Appendix 5).

The competition work must be accompanied by abstracts in which it is necessary to indicate main provisions and results of the work. Abstracts *should not exceed 3 pages* .

The text is aligned in width with automatic hyphenation. Sheet orientation is portrait. Paragraph indent – 1.25. All charts and tables must be inserted into the text. The list of references is drawn up in accordance with GOST. Footnotes to the text are given in square brackets indicating the source number in the list of references.

The author's initials and surname should be printed at the top center of the page. The next line indicates the full name of the university (organization), then the city. Below, in the middle of the line, indicate the title, then keywords (no more than 5 words or phrases). Then the text is placed. At the end, the initials and surname of the scientific supervisor, his academic degree and academic title are indicated.

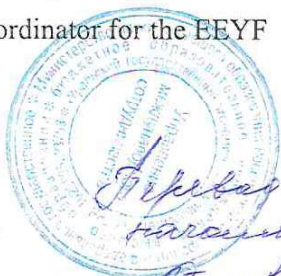
