1. GENERAL REGULATIONS

1.1 The "IV Sports Programming Championship", hereinafter referred to as the "Competition", is held as part of the Eurasian Economic Youth Forum with the aim of promoting the sport of sports programming in the Sverdlovsk Region and other regions. The Competition aims to meet performance standards, improve athletes' skills in sports programming, select athletes for participation in all-Russian competitions and identify the strongest athletes to form sports teams in the Sverdlovsk Region in the field of sports programming.

1.2 The Competition is organized with the goal of further popularizing and developing the sport of programming in the Sverdlovsk Region.

1.3 The objectives of the Competition are:

- a) To identify the strongest athletes who will be selected to form teams representing the Sverdlovsk Region at competitions in the field of programming;
- b) Improving the sportsmanship of athletes in "sports programming";
- c) Assigning sports categories in accordance with the Unified All-Russian Sports Classification;
- d) Selection of athletes for All-Russian competitions.

1.4 Within the framework of these competitions, organizers observe:

- The prohibition of any illegal influence on the results of sports competitions included in this regulation;
- A ban on gambling at bookmakers and betting shops by betting on official sports events in accordance with requirements established by Paragraph 3 of Part 4 of Article 26.2 of the Federal Law No. 329-FZ of December 4, 2007, "On Physical Culture and Sports" in the Russian Federation.

1.5 This regulation is a challenge for the competition (basis for sending, including athletes, coaches, and other participants in physical culture and sports).

2. THE RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF ORGANIZERS OF SPORTS COMPETITIONS

2.1 The organizers of the sports event are the Federal State-Funded Educational Institution of Higher Education, Ural State University of Economics (hereinafter referred to as USUE).

2.2 USUE, as one of the organizers, is responsible for ensuring public order and safety measures in accordance with applicable laws and regulations of the Russian Federation.

2.3 USUE has the obligation to provide necessary infrastructure and technical facilities on the premises to be used for the event in compliance with safety regulations for official sports events.

2.4 USUE is committed to preventing participants and competition staff from displaying the attributes of foreign countries and territories that engage in unfriendly actions against the Russian

Federation, Russian entities and individuals listed in the Decree of the Government of the Russian Federation № 430-p dated 05/03/2022. This includes the use of material objects with names, state symbols, geographic boundaries of these countries and territories, as well as other images that could identify these countries and territories.

2.5 Direct responsibility for the event "sports programming" is assigned to the following members of the judging panel: the chief judge, Mikhail Alexandrovich Panov, and the chief secretary, Ivan Anatolyevich Surin.

3. ENSURING THE SAFETY AND WELL-BEING OF PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS AT SPORTS EVENTS, PROVIDING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN CASE OF EMERGENCY, IMPLEMENTING ANTI-DOPING MEASURES DURING SPORTS COMPETITIONS.

3.1 Sports competitions are conducted in accordance with Federal Law No. 329-FZ of December 4, 2007, "On Physical Culture and Sport in the Russian Federation."

Sports events may be held at venues that have the necessary infrastructure and video surveillance systems to identify individuals during their attendance at official sporting events, as well as technical equipment in compliance with the rules for safety during official sporting events in accordance with paragraph 9 of Article 37, "Sporting Facilities," of 329-FZ.

3.2 The safety of participants and spectators at sporting events is ensured in accordance with the regulations for safety during official sporting competitions, approved by the Decree of the Government of the Russian Federation No. 353 of April 18, 2014.

3.3 The provision of emergency medical assistance is carried out in accordance with the regulations of the Ministry of Health of the Russian Federation, dated October 23, 2020, No. 1144n, "On Approval of the Procedure for Organizing Medical Care for Persons Engaged in Physical Culture and Sports (including During the Preparation and Conduct of Physical Education and Sports Events), Including the Procedure for Medical Examination of Persons Wishing to Undergo Sports Training, Engage in Physical Education and Sports in Organizations and (or) Comply with the Standards of Tests (Tests) of the All-Russian Physical Culture and Sports Complex "Ready for Work and Defense" (GTO), and Forms of Medical Certificates on Admission to Participate in Physical Culture Events."

The basis for a person participating in sports to be admitted to sports events is a medical certificate for participation in sports competitions. When applying to participate in a sports competition, a "Admitted" mark is placed next to the athlete's name, certified by a sports medicine physician and their personal seal.

The application for participating in a sports event is signed by the sports medicine physician, including their full name, surname and patronymic (if applicable), and is certified by the seal of a licensed medical organization providing physical therapy and sports medicine services.

3.4 Participation in competitions shall only be permitted if the participant has valid accident insurance, which covers sudden, unforeseeable events that may lead to treatment in a medical facility, disability, or death of the insured individual. The insurance policy must be provided to the relevant authorities for each participant in the competition.

Insurance coverage for participants may be provided through both budgetary and extrabudgetary funds in accordance with applicable legislation of the Russian Federation.

3.5 Anti-doping measures for sports events in the Russian Federation are implemented in accordance with All-Russia Anti-Doping Regulations, as approved by Order No. 464 issued by the Ministry of Sport of the Russian Federation on June 24, 2021.

In order to implement the measures outlined in the National Anti-Doping Plan for Russian sports, which was adopted by the Independent Public Anti-Doping Commission on 1st February 2017 and approved by Decree No. 1456-r of the Government of the Russian Federation dated 7th October 2017, athletes and coaches participating in official sporting events must undergo training and obtain a certificate confirming their knowledge of anti-doping regulations.

3.6. The specific requirements of this regulation are detailed in the regulations for individual sporting events and must not contradict these regulations. Regulations for regional and inter-municipal sporting competitions are developed individually for each event by the relevant sports federation and approved by both the federation and other organizers. If the same individuals are responsible for organizing several regional and inter-municipal competitions, a single set of regulations may be applied to all such events.

3.7 In accordance with the regulations on the organization and conduct of official physical culture and sports events on the territory of the Russian Federation under conditions of continued risks of COVID-19 spread, approved by the Ministry of Sports of Russia and the Chief Sanitary Inspectorate of Russia on 31 July 2020, as well as other methodological guidelines issued by the Federal Consumer Rights Protection Service, the Federation provides for:

- Monitoring of the use of personal protective equipment (masks) by participants and support staff of the event, except during competitive and training sessions (for athletes), as well as monitoring of the use of such equipment by participants,
- Compliance with a 1.5-meter social distancing between participants (including staff, athletes, and others),
- Awarding without physical contact in compliance with social distancing.

Conducting briefings with team representatives regarding the need for participants to adhere to the requirements of the Ministry of Sports of the Russian Federation and Rospotrebnadzor. Immediately inform the team representative if there are any deviations in the health of participants or if personal protective equipment is not used.

The sports facility is responsible for ensuring compliance with methodological recommendations, including: MR 3.1/2.1.0184-20 (recommendations on organizing the work of sports organizations during the ongoing risk of COVID-19 spread) and MR 3.1/2.1.0192-20 (prevention of new coronavirus infection in sports facilities). This includes:

- Organizing thermometry for participants and staff using non-contact thermometers upon entry to the facility.

The sports facility provides conditions for hygienic hand treatment using skin antiseptics before and during events, as well as conducts daily cleaning of the premises and disinfection of sports equipment.

The facility disinfects locker rooms and restrooms every two hours, as well as contact surfaces such as handrails, door handles, and railings. To ensure safety, the facility restricts access to the premises for individuals not involved in the competitive process, such as spectators. Additionally, the facility airs the premises every two hours and after events to maintain a clean and safe environment.

5.1. THE MANAGEMENT OF THE COMPETITION. ENSURING SECURITY

5.1.1 The organizers of the sporting event are the Federal State-funded Educational Institution of Higher Learning "Ural State University of Economics" (hereafter referred to as "USUE").

5.1.2 USUE is responsible among the organizers for taking measures to ensure public order and safety in accordance with relevant legislation of the Russian Federation.

5.1.3 USUE must provide the necessary facilities and technical equipment on the premises to be used for the event in compliance with regulations for safety during official sporting events.

5.1.4 Responsibility for the direct conduct of the competition in the sport of "sports programming" is entrusted to a panel of judges, consisting of the chief judge Mikhail Alexandrovich Panov and the chief secretary Ivan Anatolyevich Surin.

5.1.5 USUE takes full responsibility for ensuring the security of participants and spectators throughout the event.

5.1.6. The individuals responsible for ensuring compliance with safety standards and regulations during the competition include:

6. FINANCING

6.1 USUE incurs expenses related to the organization of medical support, the purchase of office supplies, the rental of sports facilities, and other expenses associated with ensuring public order and security during the events.

6.2 The costs associated with sending participants, coaches, and representatives are covered by the sending organization (including travel expenses, accommodation, daily allowance, and insurance for participants).

**7. TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION OF PARTICIPANTS AND
SUBMISSION OF APPLICATIONS**

7.1 Preliminary applications for participation in a sports event are submitted electronically via a dedicated registration form on the EEYF website (www.eurasia-forum.ru).

7.2 In order to compete, participants must submit the following documents:

- A completed application form for participation in the Event (Appendix 1), which can be downloaded from the EEYF website. One applicant will register as the team leader, and the remaining participants will register as team members.

- If necessary, due to epidemiological circumstances, each participant will need to provide a medical certificate confirming a negative result from a laboratory test for coronavirus infection.

8. THE COMPETITION PROGRAM

8.1. Venue of the competition: Sverdlovsk region, Yekaterinburg, ul. 8 Marta 62, office 551

9. AWARDING

9.1 Participants who finish in the first, second and third place in each event will be awarded with diplomas and medals.

9.2 The total prize money for the tournament is 25,000 rubles.

- 13,000 rubles for first place

- 7,000 rubles for second place

- 5,000 rubles for third place

9.3 The awards ceremony will take place at the Ural State University of Economics on March 8, 2022 in Yekaterinburg. The exact date and time will be determined by the organizing committee of the Eurasian Economic Youth Forum.

9.4 Funds will be transferred to the winner's (prize-winner's) bank account within two months after the necessary personal information has been provided by the winner (prize-winner) via email: panov79@ya.ru, in accordance with Russian Federation legislation for the transfer of funds to an individual.
