1. General regulations

- 1.1. These Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations) govern the procedure for organizing and holding the International Competition of Research Papers "Law Enforcement and Human Rights Activities: Evolution and Innovation" (hereinafter referred to as the Competition).
- 1.2. The Competition is held within the framework of the Congress of Management and Law of the Eurasian Economic Youth Forum (hereinafter referred to as the EEYF). The Internet address of the EEYF website is www.eurasia-forum.ru
 - 1.3. Competition Organizer:

Ural State University of Economics (USUE), Department of Public Law.

1.4. Co-organizers of the Competition:

Universities-organizers of foreign and regional EEYF sites that have chosen this Competition for implementation at their sites. The list of foreign and regional sites that have chosen this Competition is indicated on the Competition page of the Congress of Management and Law of the EEYF website, as well as on the foreign/regional Sites of the EEYF website themselves.

- 1.5. Partners of the Competition:
- Ural branch of the Free Economic Society of Russia.
- 1.6. The purpose of the competition is to increase students' interest in the chosen profession, stimulate interest in research activities in the field of protection of rights, develop interest in current issues of human rights protection and individual dignity, the place and role of a citizen in the legal system, the relationship between the state and the individual, the activities of state and public human rights institutions.
 - 1.7. Objectives of the competition:
 - to identify the analytical potential of young lawyers, economists and financiers;
 - to ensure the integration of youth science with the global research environment;
- to develop skills in conducting comparative legal research, developing recommendations for improving legislation;
- to assess the current situation and strategic thoughts in the field of development of the country and a specific territory;
 - to educate the legal consciousness of young people;
- to disseminate a clear understanding of the relationship between rights and freedoms with responsibility, the ability to resolve conflict situations by legal means.

2. Scientific directions of the Competition

- 2.1. Competition works are submitted to the competition in the following areas:
- Interaction of state and non-state actors in human rights policy.
- Development of legal frameworks for monitoring the results of human rights activities.

- Improving the system of legal means of protecting the law.
- Development and observance of the principles of the rule of law.
- Improving the quality of administration of justice.
- Bringing the human rights system of Russia into line with international standards.
- Legal education in the field of protection of rights.
- Resolution of disputes and conflicts between citizens, public organizations and state bodies, officials by legal means.
- Main directions of formation and features of implementation of criminal procedure policy of the Russian Federation.
 - Fight against corruption by means of criminal law
- 2.2. The choice of topic is determined on the basis of the approximate topics of the competition works (Appendix 1). The topic can also be proposed independently, taking into account the scientific direction of the competition "Law enforcement and human rights activities: evolution and innovation", a comparative legal analysis of the legislation of the Russian Federation, countries of Asia, Africa, Latin America on the selected topic (3-5 countries).

It is also possible to conduct a comparative legal analysis of the legislation of the EAEU and BRICS countries

- 2.3. Based on the results of the conducted research, recommendations should be proposed for improving the legislation of the Russian Federation taking into account the experience of foreign countries. The result of the research may be proposals for harmonization of legislation, which will contribute to the development of the law of the future.
- 2.4. The research is divided into the following structural units: introduction, analytical section, conclusion, bibliography.

Introduction - substantiates the choice of the research topic, its relevance and novelty, formulates the purpose and objectives of the research. When determining relevance, it is necessary to take into account that this is nothing more than identifying the degree of development of the topic, determining the place of the research among similar ones in this area. In other words, it is necessary to show what has already been done in this area by others and what the author of this work has to do.

Establishing novelty involves showing the difference between the results obtained and those already known.

The purpose of the research is the main direction of research activity. This is what, in the most general form, should be achieved as a result of work on the research. Formulating the goal allows you to answer the question "Why is the research being conducted?"

Objectives are sequential steps that ensure the achievement of the set goal. Research objectives concretize the goal, determine the main content of the work.

The analytical part is a comparison of the legislation of various countries on the selected topic. An analytical review of the literature on the topic is carried out, an analysis of certain scientific phenomena in the aspect of the research problem is given. The analytical part can be divided into chapters.

Conclusion - the essence of the scientific research results of the work is briefly stated, the obtained data are summarized in the form of conclusions, theses. At the same time, it is necessary that the content of the conclusion is related to the objectives and content of the work. Another important point: the conclusions must be formulated in a substantive plan, i.e. not just the results of the study are named, but their essence is briefly revealed.

3. Conditions of participation in the Competition

3.1. Senior schoolchildren, students, postgraduates of educational organizations, academic institutes and other interested organizations of Russia and foreign countries under 35 years of age (hereinafter referred to as Participants) are invited to participate in the Competition.

Works prepared by young scientists - postgraduates and candidates of sciences, are not accepted for the Competition.

- 3.2.Completed works, completed individually or by a group of authors (teams of up to 3 people) are submitted to the Competition.
 - 3.3. One participant (one team) has the right to submit only one work to the Competition.
- 3.4. Works of participants that do not meet these requirements will not be accepted for participation in the Competition.
- 3.5. There is no registration fee for participation in the Competition. Expenses for accommodation of out-of-town participants, food and transportation costs for participation in the in-person stage of the Competition are paid by the participants themselves or by the sending organizations.

4. Procedure and terms of the Competition

- 4.1 The Competition is an annual event and is held during the summer semester. The final dates for the Competition, as well as its main stages, are established by the order of the Chairman of the Organizing Committee of the EEYF, the Rector of USUE and are published on the Competition pages of the EEYF website.
 - 4.2. The Competition is held in three stages.
- 4.2.1. The first stage (until March 20, 2025 inclusive) acceptance and registration of competitive research papers in the selected section of the Competition; checking the papers for compliance with the requirements for the papers.

The first stage is held by the organizing committees of the Competition of the relevant sites:

- the organizing committee of the main site of USUE;
- the organizing committees of foreign/regional sites.

If less than 10 competitive papers in any section are received at a foreign/regional site, then the Competition for this section at this site is considered to have failed, and the received papers participate in the competition of the main site of USUE on a general basis.

4.2.2. The second stage (qualifying) (from March 21 to April 1, 2025) - examination of competitive research papers registered and admitted to the Competition based on the results of the first stage. Determination of the finalists of the Competition from the USUE site and the finalists of the Competition from foreign/regional sites.

4.2.3. **The third stage (final) (April 23-24, 2025)** - defense of competitive research papers of the international finals of the Competition; determination of winners in each section of the Competition; awarding.

The third stage is held between the finalists of the international finals of the Competition through public in-person defense of competition papers in sections corresponding to the thematic areas of the Competition. Defense of works remotely, using online communication, is carried out in agreement with the organizing committee of the Competition.

The third stage is (final) the defense and presentation of the finalists' competitive research papers, determining the winners of the Competition. It is held in person at USUE, between the Competition finalists through a public defense of the competition papers.

Participation in the final is also possible using remote technologies - registered participants and experts gain access to USUE cloud resources based on the Tolk platform and connect to interactive sessions within the events through teams created in Tolk.

Based on the results of the Competition, a collection of abstracts of the finalists' papers is published. The collection is published as a corresponding chapter of the annual collection of EEYF materials no later than 3 months after the Competition. The collection of EEYF materials is posted on the EEYF website.

5. Requirements for submitted documentation and rules for registration of competitive works

- 5.1. Works are submitted to the Competition Organizing Committee in electronic form through a special registration form on the EEYF website www.eurasia-forum.ru.
 - 5.2. To participate in the Competition, the following package of documents must be submitted:
- 1) Author's application for participation in the Competition (Appendix 2) submitted by filling out the participant's registration form on the EEYF website. If the work is prepared by a group of authors, one of the authors registers as the team captain and attaches the work, the other participants register as team members, without attaching the work.

Participants, representatives of foreign/regional Competition sites, submit applications for the Competition through the registration form from the page of the foreign/regional site.

- 2) text of the paper with the title page (Appendix 3) attached as a separate file to the participant's registration form;
- 3) thesis of the paper, reflecting the main provisions and results of the paper attached as a separate file to the participant's registration form.
 - 5.3. The competition work must meet the following requirements:
- 1) the work must be submitted within the deadlines set by the rector of USUE and published on the EEYF website;
 - 2) the work must correspond to the competition topic;
- 3) reference material is required: links to sources from which quotations were used, digital data in the text, tables, graphs, diagrams, a list of references (at least 10 sources);
- 4) the scientific work must be the author's, the percentage of originality of the text is at least 60%;

5) the abstract of the work must be attached to the scientific work. The work must be formatted as follows: file in *.doc or *.rtf format, the file name must indicate the last name of the author(s). Times New Roman font, 14 pt size, line spacing 1.5. All margins 20 mm. The text is justified without hyphenation. All diagrams and tables must be inserted into the text. Paragraph indentation - 1.25. Orientation of the sheet is portrait. Volume of work: 10-45 pages.

The list of references is prepared in accordance with GOST R 7.0.100-2018. Footnotes in the text are given in square brackets with the source number in the list of references.

Typical structure of the work: introduction; three chapters (theoretical, analytical, recommendatory); conclusion and list of used literature.

Each research work must be accompanied by an abstract reflecting the general idea of the work. Abstracts must be prepared as follows: line spacing 1.5 on A4 sheets, Times New Roman font, font size - 14 pt, margins - 20 mm on each side. The volume of abstracts is no more than 3 pages. The text of the abstract must have an annotation, keywords, information about the scientific supervisor.

6. Procedure and criteria for evaluation of works

6.1. The Organizing Committee selects projects for further expert evaluation according to the requirements specified in paragraph 5 of the Regulation.

To conduct expert evaluation of works, an expert committee of the Competition is created, as well as an expert committee of the Competition at the site of the Republic of Tajikistan. All decisions of the expert committees are recorded and signed by the chairman, secretary and members of the expert committees (Appendix 4.5).

- 6.2. During the second (selection) stage, expert commissions conduct an examination of the participants' research projects and determine the finalists of the Competition. The 15 best works are selected for the final, including 5 works from each foreign/regional site of the Competition.
- 6.3. The lists of finalists are published on the Competition page and information letters about reaching the finals are sent to the finalists. If for any reason a finalist cannot participate in the finals in person, by decision of the Competition Organizing Committee, he/she may be given the opportunity to participate in the competition using distance technologies (online). If a finalist cannot participate in the online Competition finals, the participant who took the next place according to the results of the selection round is included in the list of finalists.

Criteria for evaluating competition works at the second (selection) stage:

- 1) work design up to 10 points;
- 2) relevance of the research topic and its compliance with the topic of the EEF up to 10 points;
- 3) content of the research: the presence of an extensive comparative legal analysis, logic, scientific style and literacy of presentation - up to 40 points;
- 4) practical significance of the research results, the presence and validity of recommendations for improving the current legislation - 20 points.
 - 5) level of originality of the text up to 20 points Maximum score – 100 points

6.4. During the third (final) stage, members of the expert commissions fill out an expert sheet for each finalist of the Competition.

Criteria for assessing participants during the in-person defense of their work at the third (final) stage:

- 1) logicality and persuasiveness of presentation up to 10 points
- 2) presentation up to 10 points;
- 3) defense (answers to experts' questions) up to 30 points.
- 6.5. To determine the results, the points from the qualifying and final stages are summed up. The maximum total score is 150 points.

7. Competition Management

- 7.1. The Competition is managed by the EEYF Directorate and the Competition Organizing Committee.
- 7.2. An organizing committee approved by the order of the Rector of USUE is formed to organize and conduct the Competition. The organizing committee includes:
 - Chairman Rector of USUE;
 - Co-Chairman Vice-Rector for Social Work and Youth Policy of USUE;

Members of the organizing committee:

- Scientific Directors of the Competition Head of the Department of Public Law, Head of the Department of Business Law;
- Competition Coordinators Lecturer of the Department of Public Law; Lecturer of the Department of Business Law.
 - Chairman and members of the Competition expert commission;
 - Representatives of the Competition partner organizations,
 - Secretary of the Competition employee of the Department of Business Law.
- 7.3. The Organizing Committee shall exercise general management of the organization and holding of the Competition, and shall perform the following functions:
- sending out information letters to universities and organizations of the Russian Federation and other countries, no later than three months before the final stage;
- accepting and organizing the processing of scientific papers, as well as registering mandatory and additional documentation of participants no later than 15 days before the start of the final, third stage of the Competition;
- examination of scientific papers by expert commissions within the framework of the second stage, no later than 10 days before the start of the final, third stage of the Competition;
- sending out information letters to educational and scientific organizations of the Russian Federation and other countries, notifying them of the advancement of young scientists and students to the third round of the Competition;
- forming and publishing the Competition program and/or the EEYF program with information about the Competition;
 - holding the third stage (final) of the Competition;
 - awarding the winners;

- formation and transfer to the USUE Publishing House of a collection of abstracts of the
 Competition finalists' works. The collection of EEYF materials is posted on the EEYF website.
 - 7.3.1. The Chairman of the Organizing Committee:
- approves the Competition Regulations, signs the order on holding the Competition and the composition of the Competition Organizing Committee, the order on the composition of the expert commissions of the Competition areas;
 - carries out general management of the organization and holding of the Competition events.
 - 7.3.2. The Co-Chairman of the Organizing Committee:
- carries out direct management of the organization and holding of the EEFM, within the framework of which the Competition is held, is the chairman of the Competition expert commission, together with the scientific director of the Competition, forms the composition of the Competition expert commission.
- 7.3.3. The expert committee of the Competition shall include highly qualified teachers, leading scientists and specialists from the organizers of the EEYF, the Competition, as well as invited experts from universities, academic institutes, other organizations and institutions. The number of members of the expert committees shall be from 3 to 5 people, including more than half of them being representatives of third-party organizations. The composition of the expert committee shall be published on the Competition page of the EEYF website.
 - 7.3.4. The Scientific Director of the Competition:
- prepares the draft Regulations on the Competition and submits them for approval to the Rector, prepares amendments and additions to it;
 - is the co-chairman of the expert committee of the Competition;
 - selects the composition of the expert committee of the Competition;
 - 7.3.5. The Competition Coordinator, together with his/her assistant and the working group:
 - ensures the invitation of the members of the Competition expert committee;
 - sends out information letters to universities in the Russian Federation and Eurasian countries;
- organizes the registration and verification of received works according to the established requirements, sends works to the members of the expert committee for evaluation;
 - organizes and monitors the progress of the Competition;
 - organizes the work of the expert committee during the third stage of the Competition;
- organizes the registration of diplomas and the awarding of the winners and prize-winners of the Competition;
- organizes the collection of abstracts of the Competition finalists and their transfer to the USUE
 Publishing House for inclusion in the collection of materials of the EEYF;
 - prepares a report on the Competition.

8. Awarding of the winners

8.1. Based on the results of the in-person defense, the winners and prize winners of the Competition are determined; they are awarded Diplomas of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd degree and orders for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place, respectively.

Participants who take 4th and 5th places are awarded Certificates for 4th and 5th places, respectively. All participants in the third stage of public defense of projects receive certificates of finalists of the Competition, and scientific supervisors receive letters of gratitude.

- 8.2. The winners and prize winners of each thematic area are awarded cash prizes within the framework of the prize fund of the Competition, established on the basis of the order of the rector of USUE and in accordance with the protocol of the expert commission of the Competition.
- 8.3. If the winner or prize winner of the Competition is a group of authors (team), the cash prize is distributed among all members of the group (team) in equal shares.
- 8.4. If, according to the decision of the expert commission, several participants take the prize place, the cash prize is distributed among them.
- 8.5. Cash prizes (including payment of personal income tax) are transferred by the founder of the Competition within 1.5 months to the personal accounts of the winners and prize winners according to the details provided to the coordinator of the Competition, as well as upon timely provision of copies of other requested documents. Cash prizes to foreign participants are issued at the USUE cash desk on the day of the awards ceremony.
